



Acreage: 36 acres

County: Onondaga

Trails: 0.4 miles

With over 1,300 feet of wild shoreline on the west side of Otisco Lake, this new preserve is the Land Trust's first in the watershed. The preserve provides prime habitat for Bald Eagles and many water birds.

NATURAL HISTORY

Several cascading streams flow through the 36-acre preserve and into the lake below. A hiking trail passes through mature forest and descends steeply to the water's edge. Along the lakeshore, visitors will find a flat point flanked by rugged shale cliffs. Conserving this land protects Otisco Lake's water quality and scenic character, and offers an important outdoor recreational opportunity with rare public access to the lake.

HISTORY

The land that forms the Otisco Lake Preserve was owned by the Stopyro family whose grandfather farmed the property as far back as the 1920s. The Land Trust was able to acquire the site in 2015 due to a generous, anonymous gift and broad community support. Since then, FLLT has added a parking area with an interpretive kiosk and a half-mile hiking trail.
