CONSERVED FOREVER

The Finger Lakes Land Trust (FLLT) is committed to conserving land in perpetuity – beyond our lifetimes and for the benefit of future generations. We create nature preserves and conservation areas that are open to the community. Special places like Grimes Glen County Park in Ontario County, the Lick Brook gorge preserves in Tompkins County, and Carpenter Falls near Skaneateles Lake.

The Land Trust upholds conservation easements on land that remains in private ownership. Conservation easements are voluntary legal agreements that permanently protect land by limiting future development. By using this flexible tool, the Land Trust has conserved thousands of acres of farmland and land that provides habitat for wide-ranging animals such as black bear and bobcats.

PROTECTING LANDS AND WATERS

Our work results in the conservation of our most cherished undeveloped landscapes – scenic farms, rugged gorges, majestic forests, and pristine shorelines. By conserving lands that are vital to water quality, we also help protect our drinking water and the future of the 11 lakes that are the heart of our region. The Land Trust has protected shoreline on Otisco, Skaneateles, Owasco, Cayuga, Seneca, Keuka, and Canandaigua Lakes. We have also secured lands that buffer over 127 miles of stream bank and helped protect over 9 miles of the Finger Lakes Trail.
